

Right To Know Notification

Parents are informed that under NCLB, they have the right to know the qualifications of any teacher dealing with their student(s), including Title I teachers. The notice also states that the following information is required by NCLB:

- (1) whether the teacher has met the State requirements for licensure and certification for the grade levels and subject-matters in which the teacher provides instruction;
- (2) whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- (3) the college major and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- (4) whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications;
- (5) each Title I school will provide each parent “timely notice that the parent’s child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who is not highly qualified”

Parents who request such information may contact the principal to peruse such information.
